GREAT news for all who pay taxes:
St. Mary's School is a federally recognized not for profit organization, and this year <u>under the CARES Act</u> , cash gifts given by the end of this year are <u>deductible up to 100%</u> of an individual's adjusted gross income (AGI). Normally, this is limited to 30%.
<u>NOTE</u> : Even if you don't itemize your taxes you can deduct up to a \$300 donation.
<u>This is only available this year(2020)</u> !
<u>Further information:</u> For anyone wanting to give <i>more than 30% of AGI and receive a full deduction</i> , gifts must be in cash (not securities or real property). For example, a donor may find it better to sell appreciated securities, realize the capital gain and raise their AGI. <i>In addition, giving beyond the 100% limitation can be carried forward and used over the next five years!</i>
So, giving to St. Mary's School this year could stretch your donation for years to come. Please consult your own tax advisor if needed.
