Please NOTE the following:

❖ A wonderful tradition our school has had for over 45 years is a day at **Klemgard Park.** The park is between Pullman and Colfax and it has 59 acres of land that includes a trail, wide open spaces, an area of play equipment and a barbecue pit. Well-kept bathrooms, etc. It's just a space and place for the whole family. Given that it is outdoors and given the recent CDC guidelines, we are hoping as many parents who can will join us for the day of fun and sun. (There have only be two of the 45 years we've been rained out and had to make the school into Klemgard!!!) Below is some key information for June 2nd. Please call if you have any questions. Given their age and length of day, we have found it best to have only

students from Kindergarten through 8th Grade attend Klemgard and the Preschoolers and PreK will have their own "little" Klemgard at school. **IF you are planning on driving students (not just your own) to Klemgard please check the information in last week's Newsletter.**

Klemgard Park---guidelines, behavior and dress

Behavior: Students are to stay on the trail when hiking. **Grades K, 1 and 2** must be

accompanied by at least one adult on the trails.

Grades 3 through 7 must go with at least one other upper grade student or

adult.

Dress: Socks and good solid –closed toe---shoes (tennis) must be worn for hiking and

playing; sunscreen; dress modestly; no "short shorts nor skimpy straps or see thru

blouses".

No phones, no iPods, no video games, etc. are allowed. Be ready to play and enjoy

the outdoors. Be ready to enjoy God's world!

Booster seats: For students who need them are REQUIRED—if you child is not riding in your car.

Food:

Gr. Kindergarten+ Gr. 2 each student brings veggies (tray or bag)

Gr. 1 each student brings 2 LARGE cans of Bush's baked beans each student brings fruit (cut-up pieces OR salad OR trays of)

Gr. 5 and Gr. 6: each student brings *TWO large* bags of chips Gr. 7 and Gr. 8: each student brings TWO dozen cookies

The Hot dogs (Costco), buns, condiments and juice will be provided by the school. Water and rest rooms are at the site. You may want your child bring his/her water bottle too. School will have some cases of water on site, just in case.

❖ Special Announcement about our students in the upper grades and their participation in Math Olympiad for Elementary and Middle School (MOEMS): This year, MOEMS served over 100,000 students on approximately 2,800 different teams nationally and about 50,000 students on about 1,000 teams in more than 30 countries (internationally). Since 1979, this competition has provided challenging, thought-provoking problems that stretch the abilities of 4-8th grade students, strengthening their foundation for both assessment tests and more advanced studies. This competition consists of five monthly challenges, from November to March, with five very difficult questions featured each month. Our students always have responded to the challenge with eagerness and enthusiasm.

In the <u>Elementary category</u> for grades 4-6, the following students: placed in the **top 50th percentile**:

Aubrey Vogl, Mason Poxleitner, and Ali Wilson.

placed in the **top 40th percentile** and earning third place at our school is *Bella Visger*;

placing in the **top 30th percentile** and earning second place in our school is *Claire Bernards*;

placing in the top 25th percentile

and earning first place in our school for the Elementary category is *Matthew Ristine*.

In the <u>Middle School category</u> for grades 6-8, the following students:

tying for **first place**, **both in the top 50th percentile**, *Gianna Niehenke and Wyatt Thornycroft*

Congratulations to all of our participants this year and especially those who won an individual award. Most participants in these contests rank among the best mathematics students in their schools. Therefore, those who earned an individual award, rank among the best of the best internationally.

Some Questions

- Q. Will masks be required when the school (Kindergarten through 8th graders) go to Klemgard Park?
- A Since the students will be out in the fresh air on June 2nd. masks will **not** be required.
- Q. Will any of the procedures change before school is out on June 4th?
- A. The changes have been made **ONLY** for those *who have been fully vaccinated*. Unvaccinated people, which at this point means children are **still required** to wear masks and practice social distancing.

We, the teachers and staff who work with your child(ren) will continue to wear masks while working with them.

- Q. Given the new guidelines from the CDC, are you going to allow the children to be outside without masks on?
- **A.** According to CDC guidelines, children still need to wear a mask and continue to practice social distancing in order to be protected. It's important for the children to be in well ventilated spaces too (and as you know, our classrooms *are* well ventilated).
- Q. How long will be children be required to wear masks?
- A. For this school year, it is required through the last day of school, June 4th. Masks will not be required either at Klemgard (June 2) nor at the Mass on the Grass (Friday, June 4th) since we will be outdoors. However, any unvaccinated adults who are present must wear masks.
- Q. For the school's Summer Program, will the children have to wear masks?
- **A.** Summer Program starts on Tuesday, June 8. Just so you know, masks will **not be required.** That is a decision left up to parents if they want their child masked. Any adult *not vaccinated* is required to wear a mask.
- Q. When will St. Mary's <u>Church</u> open up and be back to things as they were before the pandemic?
- **A.** The weekend of June 5/6 St. Mary's the following will happen:
 - The new Mass schedule will begin—no limit to numbers coming to Mass Saturday Mass is at 5:00 p.m. in Moscow Sunday Mass in Genesee at 7:30 a.m.
 Sunday Mass in Moscow both at 9:30 a.m. and 11:00 a.m.
 - 2) Communion will be offered under both species
 - 3) Face masks are no longer required. However, anyone who wishes to use them, they are free to do. IF someone needs social distancing, the front three rows are saved for them, as well as the choir loft. All ropes will be taken down beginning that weekend too.
 - 4) Liturgical ministries will begin to be fully operative again.
 - 5) Parish Center is fully opened.

We hope these responses addresses your questions. Do know, Fr. Joe or Sister Margaret are here to answer any others you may have. Thank you for both your understanding and support!
