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## Please note the following:

As a parent, what answer would you give to the following questions regarding the need for childcare when it's not offered at the school?

- Do the days with no school breaks cause a difficult schedule challenge for you?
- Are you a stay-at-home parent that would like to earn some more money during these breaks with kiddos you know?
- ❖ Would you be open to "sharing" days in a parent co-op (one parent takes a couple kiddos one day, the next parent the next day, and so on)?
- Do you have resources you would like to share with other parents (teenage student that is looking to make extra money during the breaks, a babysitter that would like to expand his/her group of kiddos)?
- ❖ Any other ideas that you may have? IF you have said "yes" to any of the above questions. It would be good to meet with other parents who have similar concerns. See what Karen Richel is suggesting on page 5 of this Newsletter.

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**MASKS:** Do you need masks for your child(ren). One of our parents, Samantha Davis does make such masks. She wanted to share her business with the parents. Please go to **page 5** of this Newsletter for more information.

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<u>Speaking of masks</u>: thank you parents for seeing that your child is masked daily. It might be good to have their mask in their pocket when they come to school since they are outside at play. When the bell rings they can take their mask out of their pocket to put it on.

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**Just so you know**: we have the Vault PCR tests from the state of Idaho that allows a person to know if s/he has contacted the virus. These tests use saliva, do not require a doctor's order, are highly sensitive and result in 24-72 hours. There is no cost for this service and it is mailed via UPS free of cost. If you need a test, just ask the school office for one.

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### **QUESTIONS Parents Are Asking:**

- Q. Do my children must wear closed toe shoes and socks?
- A. Yes, both are required.
- Q. School uniforms: when can we expect to be able to order uniforms for Masses on Fridays?
- A. At this time, Schoolbelles, is experiencing a backlog of supplies. Our recommendation is to definitely order/purchase one shirt with the school logo from Schoolbelles. Then you could purchase the rest of the uniform locally using the Schoolbelles chart of color and clothes.
- Q. Where and by whom are masks required to be worn?
- A. By all persons (students, adults, visitors) while they are inside the school building. This is true for every person (vaccinated/unvaccinated).
- Q. Are masks required outside?
- A. No.
- Q. Where will Mass be held this year?
- A. Masses will be held at St. Mary's Parish <u>Church</u>. Check the Newsletter (or school calendar) for dates and times.
- Q. Will parents be able to attend Mass this year?
- A. Yes, all are welcome.
- Q. Are masks required to be worn in the church?
- A. Yes.

## Q. This is a change from what was sent out on August 13 to families. Why the change?

A. Father Joe wants all parents to know that he is continuing to monitor the situation the best way he can to keep our children, school, and parish as safe as possible as Covid continues to rapidly spread in Idaho. Therefore, he decided masks do need to be worn in the church by all who come to the school Mass on Fridays. Since the students will be walking in the open air to and from the church, they may choose to go mask less until they enter the church.

#### Q. Are there other health protocols for Mass?

A. The students will be sitting in a pew, and will be spread out from each other. There will be an empty pew in front and behind each class. This way each class will remain it its own "bubble".

# Q. Are there other health protocols that are happening daily?

- A. The following is in place:
  - 1) Upon arriving at school, each person (students, staff) have their temperature taken at the kiosk in the lunch room.
  - 2) Drinking fountains will remain closed off; water coolers will continue in each classroom. Students have their own water containers.
  - 3) Fogging of classrooms twice daily and cleaning desks with disinfectant wipes as needed daily.
  - 4) Humidifiers, Purifiers and fans will continue to be used in every classroom.
  - 5) Social distancing (3 feet) and Plexiglas partitions where needed will be used in the classrooms.
  - 6) Good personal hygiene (washing of hands frequently during the day and after trips to the bathroom).
  - 7) Eating lunch in their classrooms.

We are living in fluid times that are ever changing with new information almost daily. We will continue to monitor and stay in touch with the "health/medical" experts in order to make the best decisions we can for the sake of all the students and staff. Thank you and blessings!

This can sometimes create a hardship for working parents if they don't have a childcare support system.
