At morning assembly Father Joe will burns the palm branches that will be used as ashes for Ash Wednesday Mass and the beginning of Lent



## Some Questions That Have Been Asked:

#### Q. How is Samson Bright doing?

A. The latest information is that they are hoping that he will be able to transfer from ICU to a regular hospital room. The jaundice has cleared; his voice is stronger and he has been on a liquid diet for a few days. The stent appears to be doing its job. The parents truly appreciate your prayers and concerns.

## Q. How are Mrs. Bright's classes being done while she is on leave?

A. We have had several key subs working consistently with the classes: Mr. Herrenbruck continues to be their religion teacher; Mr. Bill Kerr has been teaching math for Grades 6-8; Mrs. Niehenke is teaching the science program on Fridays and Sister Margaret will be teaching history and English Language Arts starting this week. We are working together for the sake of the students until Mrs. Bright can fully return. Mrs. Bright is providing the outline of lessons for us to follow with the students so there are no gaps in their learning.

## Q. How did we do on the bake sale for the benefit of the Bright family.

- A, As soon as we have an accurate account from Friday (and the weekend since Catholic Women's League had the continuation of a bake sale for the Bright family this weekend) we'll publish it in next week's Newsletter. Special thank you to Sixth Grader, Aubrey Vogel and her fellow students who organized and sold the baked goods on their time Thursday and Friday!
- Q. Why was St. Mary's Parish School's timeline for moving from mandatory masking to optional different from Moscow School District's timeline?
- A. Moscow School District's Superintendent, Dr. Greg Bailey, had to bring his recommendations to the Moscow School Board for their decision on February 23<sup>rd</sup>.

Catholic School Boards in Idaho are advisory only and not decision making. However, Fr. Joe, our local superintendent, wanted input and advice from our School Board. Their meeting was Feb. 15. Father Joe was not able to be physically present (due to meetings in Boise) so he asked the Board members to fill out a questionnaire that he had created.

In addition to the School Board members, he gave a similar questionnaire to the faculty/staff at the school for their input to him regarding the mandate since they are the key group working with students daily.

When Father Joe returned from his meetings in Boise on February 18 he and Sister Margret met to carefully review the input/advice of the School Board members and faculty/staff. It was very clear that it was time to drop the school's masking *mandate* and transfer the mandate to the parents.

## Q. Do you have the latest CDC information?


